Partners In The News

The City of Beckley won a Landscape Preservation Award at the Seventh Annual Historic Preservation Awards in Grafton for the work on the Alfred Beckley Mill Project. Beckley Councilman Tom Sopher states that "the city was given the award because of the archeological dig. The group put forth an effort to preserve property that has historic significance on a stream that's now beginning to be utilized for public use."

Sopher also said that the mill ties together all of the trails that are currently in progress — from the Paul Cline Memorial Youth Sports Complex all the way to the Boy Scouts Summit Bechtel Reserve, all of which will tie into the New River Gorge National Trail System.

Watershed Pilot Program

The Piney Creek Watershed Association was one of three watersheds to receive a grant from the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection.

The intent of this pilot program is to assist watershed groups to manage projects, improve sustainability, and assist with staff costs. Lower Coal River and Morris Creek Watersheds also received funding.

What Are We Doing?

We are excited about a new project that is beginning at the Paul Cline Memorial Youth Sports Complex.

This project will help alleviate runoff that is occurring on the barren land adjacent to the soccer field.

PCWA will reclaim soil that was received from another area within the complex and use that soil to help stabilize the ground to help to prevent sedimentation from occurring.

We are in the initial stages but can see the great impact that this project will have for that area.
